HOSPITALS








The USNS COMFORT AND USNS MERCY HOSPITAL SHIPS HAVE BEEN DEPLOYED TO ASSIST CALIFORNIA AND NEW YORK WITH 1000 EXTRA BEDS **EACH SERVICES FOR** NON-AND MEDICAL **CORONAVIRUS PATIENTS.**

The first purposely built hospital ship in the U.S. Navy was the USS Relief in 1921. During World War II Naval hospital ships were fully equipped and designed to receive casualties direct from the battlefield. They also supplied logistical support to front line medical teams ashore. Army hospital ships were hospital transports intended and equipped to evacuate patients from forward area Army hospitals to rear hospitals or from those to the United States and were not equipped or staffed to handle large numbers of direct battle casualties. **WWII Hospital Ship**

The DeLand Naval Air Station Museum continues to stav in touch with Katherine Burlin of Fort Belvoir, Virginia, one of our members who was stationed in DeLand, Florida during WWII. In February, 2020 we featured some of her memories and we want to share more of her recollections of life on the Navy base and her memories of DeLand, Florida.

llections in Her Own Words

We asked Katherine a series of questions:

For leisure time, did you go to Downtown DeLand and if so, what are your memories, and how were you treated by DeLand citizens? Did you visit Daytona Beach or DeLeon Springs Park, and if so what do you remember?


"My friends and I went into DeLand a lot to eat, bowl and sometimes to see movies at the Athens The-

atre. I remember the Athens was "air cooled" which meant a box of straw with water running through it and a fan someplace. I also remember that sometimes small bugs were blown in, too, and we would end up scratching. I remember having shrimp cocktail at a small restaurant, then moving on to what I think was the Hunter Restaurant and finishing with sundaes at the Orange Belt Drug Store. We also went to Brooksie's (Now DeLand Stockyard Restaurant) for special dates, and the Putnam Hotel for more ordinary dates where we would have drinks and listen to the jukebox. The dining room was open one year during "the season", and it really was quite a very nice dining experience."

"The people in DeLand treated us very well. I made several good friends, ones I kept up with until their deaths...I used to visit Emma Ford regularly and also Sarah Jernigan. I have always thought of DeLand with deep affection."

"We took the bus to Daytona quite often where we went to the beach and then had dinner. The favorite place was called the Kentucky Bar which had a dining room in the back and served Former Brooksie's best fried shrimp ever. I also was invited to a number of "Flight Parties" in Daytona--usually held at a hotel or club and were quite nice. We went to DeLeon Springs quite often, and really enjoyed it."

> Do you Remember the DeLand Sun News? "I do remember the Par DeLand Sun News paper. They used to come out to our office once in awhile. Particularly as the war was over and the base was getting ready to close."

What are your recollections of the food services, the wedding chapel, German POW's and the buildings on the base?

"On the food at the mess hall, generally it was quite good. We had steaks and things the civilian population were rationed. The cooks worked very hard, and I remember they used to send sandwiches over to the WAVES barracks late at night when we were playing bridge or other activities. I don't know about the officer's mess."

"The chapel was simply a large room in the Education Building." "We always had a Protestant Chaplain, and the priest from DeLand held Catholic services."

"I do remember prisoners of war on the Base. They were housed at Daytona NAS and came by bus to DeLand NAS every day for a while. They worked around the Base oiling fans in the offices and doing small maintenance jobs. Each POW had a armed guard with him. I can't remember if they were all Germans, but I think so."

"I visited DeLand and the Fords a number of times between 1946 and 1950 when I was working for Eastern Air Lines as a flight attendant based in Miami. I believe the WAVES barracks was moved to the Stetson campus Music Department. The administration building also was moved to Stetson, and the Bachelor Officers Quarters (BOQ) became housing for married students at Stetson. Some of the Supply area became a meat packing company. The Dispensary became a local hospital for a time."

"I thought Stetson was a girl's school, as I never saw any boys there during the war. I was surprised to find it is actually coed. A number of the officers from the base lived there, as the BOQs were filled with student pilots. Instructors had to go elsewhere."




WWII 1942-1946 Deland NAS BUILDINGS









How much does it cost?

The first-time cost of a State of the Arts Plate is \$53 in addition to your vehicle's normal registration fee at time of renewal. Of that, \$20 is tax deductible. Just visit your local tag office, turn in your current plate, and receive your new plate on the spot! Future renewals are only \$25 each year in addition to the normal registration fee with \$20 being tax deductible.

Gift certificates for the State of the Arts Plate are available at your local tag office and make a great gift that also helps your community!

How is the money used?

Twenty dollars from the sale of each State of the Arts Plate sold in Volusia County goes directly to promote arts awareness right here at home. Through a variety of programs and activities, the County of Volusia and its Cultural Council work with local cultural and heritage organizations to enhance the quality of life in our community.

The more drivers that choose this plate, the more funds will be available for arts programs. It's a great way to be a Driving Force for the Arts!
