


## A TIME TO HONOR AMERICAN HEROS

The DeLand Naval Air Station Museum is dedicated to honoring all of our Veterans everyday. On this Memorial Day we remember those who died while serving our country during all wars and conflicts. We hold a special tribute for our local men and women who made the ultimate sacrifice while serving our country.

Malcolm Geoffrey Mole, Born in 1947, grew up in DeLand, and enlisted in the U.S. Navy. He was sent to Vietnam in 1967, stationed in Quang Tri Province of South Vietnam. He was assigned to the 3rd Battalion, 26th Marine Regiment, Hospital Corpsman Third Class. On January 21, 1968 his battalion came under attack and he was killed by a rocket propelled grenade as he responded to aid an injured soldier. The death of the 20 year old DeLandite is documented in the book *Last Stand at Khe Sanh by Gregg Jones*. Many who knew Mole have left tribute messages to him over the years on the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Fund website, a virtual wall dedicated to remembering every person whose name is inscribed on the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Washington, D.C.

"I TRIED" is a tribute to Malcolm Mole by a fellow corpsman who tried to save his life.



As a history buff, Ron has used his writing skills to self-publish a book about his Home Church in DeLand titled 'The History of Calvary Baptist Church, 1938-2011', and a second book titled Living the American Dream a Rags to Riches Story'. The book chronicles his life and military career, zeroing in on his life growing up in DeLand, Florida and starting from humble beginnings. The theme of the Book is 'if I can make it, you can


too'! 10% of sales go to the Wounded GI's projects.

Ron is available as a motivational speaker. He also serves as the Salute of Service (SOS) Comfort Kit Director for DeLand's First United Methodist Church (1st Church), sending small toiletry kits to GI's that are overseas in combat zones. Ron has currently ventured into two other nonprofit special projects. The first project is <u>Ole Sarge Baseball Gear for Kids (OSBBGK</u>). He buys slightly used baseball gloves and other sporting goods from Goodwill and Habitat for Humanity outlets and distributes out to various little league programs in Florida and now Georgia; and hopefully way beyond. Ron says he does not want kids to go without the equipment they need.

Ron is also working on a second venture of obtaining funding support for American Indian Schools. Ron genuinely cares about his community and strives for the highest of standards. As mentioned above, 10% of sales of Ron's 'Rags to Riches' book, goes toward funding these projects.



### **WWII HISTORY - DELAND NAVAL AIR STATION**





U.S. Navy airmen training on a Douglas SBD *Dauntless* during WWII. The SBD was equipped with guns, radio and other equipment, and was used for plane familiarization in the ARM school. Known as "90 Day Wonders", the pilots were assigned to DeLand NAS for 90 days to train on aircraft carrier landings before they continued training on the Wolverine wooden top makeshift carrier located in Lake Michigan. Approximately 15,000 pilots were trained on Lake Michigan from 1942 to 1945. 150 planes crashed during training and many of them are still submerged in 2022.






There were approximately 15,200 watch towers built in 1941 to line the U.S. Coast during WWII. One of the historic towers still exists near the 2100 block of Ocean Shore Boulevard in Ormond-by-the-Sea in Volusia County. The heart pine wood structure was last restored in 2004. It is believed to be one of only three towers still standing in Florida. The other two are in Stuart and Melbourne Beach. The towers were manned by civilian lookouts armed only with binoculars and a telephone, ready to alert the Coast Guard to any incoming threats from German U-boats and enemy aircraft. Many locals remember volunteering in the towers when they were in high school.




