



The DeLand Naval Air Station Museum participated in the City of DeLand Sport **Aviation Showcase in November.** The DNAS Museum Jenny **Replica** was transported to the event and displayed for the public. Built by the late Thomas J. Ryan, a retired United States Navv Commander, the replica is a 2/3 scale JN4 Jenny, SN-426 with a GEO Metro 3 cylinder, 65 horsepower engine. Taking over 2,000 hours to build, the aircraft is 17' long with a wing span of 27' and is painted yellow with the NAVY insignia.

Members of the DNASM were so pleased to meet Thomas C. Ryan, son of the late Commander Ryan and wife Mary Ryan. Tom flew in for the DeLand Sport Aviation Showcase and greeted the public, giving first hand information about the Jenny.

WWIII SBD=5 CRASH RECOVERY PROJECT

DNAS Museum Volunteers continue their partnership with members of the **Embry Riddle Aeronautical University Student Chapter of the International** Society of Air Safety Investigators (ISASI) complete a site visit to investigate another recovery project for a WWII SBD-5 aircraft that has been discovered in a local lake. The students are guided by ERAU Anthony Brickhouse, Associate Professor. The group continues their goal to develop a re-creation of the WWII crash site based on the Navy flight data that is available and current technology.

Boat Fire Hero







John Jarvis, retired U. S Navy Veteran from DeLand, is the son of the late Chief Jack Jarvis who was stationed at the DeLand Naval Air Station during WWII. John assisted as a Volunteer at the 25th Big Band Dance on 11/11/2016 before leaving on a trip in his boat. A few days later when he docked for the evening along the St. Johns River in Green Cove Spring, Florida he found himself in the middle of a huge explosion that rocked the marina. Police and Fire crews arrived to find several people in the water at Reynolds Park and multiple boats on fire. The boat owners had turned off their boat's electricity to work on a fuel leak. While the electricity was off the bilge pump may have kicked on, causing the fire and forcing everyone to jump into the water. Within minutes, the fire spread to four other boats.

John Jarvis, a former U.S. Navy firefighter, ran from his boat to the scene and started yelling to push the boats away to break the fire triangle up. Although the boats are charred and hardly recognizable, Jarvis jumped in the water and helped pull the two victims to safety. Both fire victims are expected to make a full recovery.
