


WWII DNAS FLIGHTLINE CHIEF

Remembering WWII Veteran



Ken Torbett January 22, 1921 - July 10, 2016







Ken Torbett was stationed at the DeLand Naval Air Base during WWII 1942-1944. At age 23, he served as a Flight Line Chief and was responsible for the training of young Navy pilots preparing for their flight mission assignments. He served in the United States Navy for 21 years, including Naval Intelligence. He had a successful business career in financial services and manufacturing. His passion for golf led him to become the inventor of the patented Gunsight Putter and the author of the book "80 Years on the Putting Green".

Ken loved DeLand. In a recent interview, he was asked about the best thing and the worst thing about being stationed in DeLand, Florida during the war. He quickly replied that there was only good memories of what a nice place DeLand was to live and how friendly and supportive the people of DeLand were to DeLand Naval Air Station personnel.

He was happy to support and passionate about the success of the DeLand Naval Air Station Museum. His strong recall about the history of the Navy base during WWII was a valuable resource of information and he was always available to consult and share facts and details of events or to confirm information about educational public displays of museum memorabilia.

We will miss his gentle demeanor and smooth southern Virginia accent. He had a great sense of humor and loved to share his passion for golf and big band music. We will remember him dancing the night away during our Big Band Hangar Dances and proudly waving in the Veterans Parade. Ken has a permanent place of honor on the DNAS WWII Mural in downtown DeLand where he sits high in the clouds in a SBD-5, representing the young pilots who trained in DeLand.








